The United Nations has designated 2005 as the World Year of Physics with the theme of Einstein in the 21th century. The first national event in the US will take place in Albuquerque, October 15 and 16.

This event is a meeting sponsored by the Quadrennial Meeting of Sigma Pi Sigma with the American Physical Society Four Corners Section, the Society of Physics Students Zone 16 meeting, the Southwestern Section of the American Association of Physics Teachers and the Arizona American Association of Physics Teachers Section.

Actually the meeting starts on Thursday October 14 with a special tour of the Trinity Site. The list of prominent speakers during the next two days includes Jocelyn Bell Burnell, co-discoverer of pulsars, John Rigdon, speaking on Einstein's legacy, John Marburger, science advisor to

the president, Carl Wiemann, speaking on Bose-Einstein condensation, and Worth Seagondollar, member of the Manhatten Project.
